

When selected for drug testing, a doping control officer or chaperone will notify you.





You will be within sight of the DCO or chaperone the entire time until you reach the doping control station.

Pick your own collection vessel in which you will provide your urine sample. Rinse your hands with water before opening the vessel.



A same gender DCO or chaperone will observe you providing the sample. This is important for the integrity of the sample.



Choose a sample collection kit. Your urine will be placed inside these containers.





Pour your urine between the B Sample and A Sample bottles and seal them.

Place your sealed bottles back into the kit.

Tell the DCO about all of the medications or substances, like vitamins, that you are taking. The DCO will record this on the Doping Control Official Record.

You may be required to provide blood as part of the drug testing process. It's a very small amount.

Review the information for accuracy and be proud that you did your part to help keep sport clean.

Take pride in being part of history at the 2nd Summer Youth Olympic Games.



Check the status of your medication. You may need to apply for a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) form.


